From the Pastor:

#### October - A Time for Change

October is a month signifying change. The leaves begin to turn beautiful colors of yellow, orange, pink, and red and every variation in between. It is a great time to take a road trip to see the beautiful scenery. The weather begins to cool off, marking an end to the endless heat of Summer. Fall decorations begin to show up, including all the Halloween pumpkins, spiderwebs (both real and not), skeletons, ghosts, monsters, and black cats.

The kids are settled in their classrooms and teachers are well into their lesson plans for the year. Farmers across the country are harvesting their crops and Fall festivals, state fairs, and other outdoor events offer a myriad of opportunities for Fall entertainment.

October also holds the end of National Hispanic Heritage month which goes from September 15<sup>th</sup> through October 15<sup>th</sup>; Columbus Day, originally observed on October 12<sup>th</sup> and now celebrated the 2<sup>nd</sup> Monday of October, commemorating the landing of Christopher Columbus in the Americas; Breast Cancer Awareness; Halloween and Reformation Day, both observed on October 31<sup>st</sup>.

Reformation Day remembers the day that Martin Luther pinned the 95 Theses on the door of Castle Church in Wittenburg, Germany<sup>i</sup>. The Theses were 95 proposals for debate concerning questionable actions by the Catholic Church meant to open discussions but ended up causing Luther to be excommunicated (or excluded) from the Church. Therefore, this day is recognized as the beginning of the Protestant Church, a time of change for many Christians beginning with the Lutheran Church and now comprising tens of thousands of denominations including the United Methodist Church.

And speaking of a time for change, the United Methodist Church is in a time of change following the separation of many churches from the UMC. But change is not a bad thing. It brings a chance for revitalization. A time to recommit ourselves to the ministry that Jesus called us to, "Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age" (Matt. 28:19-20 NIV).

The question is, how can we do more to reach our community and bring the unchurched into our congregation? It begins with relationships. Conversations with neighbors, fellow shoppers at the grocery store, beauty and barber shops, coffee shops and restaurants, gyms and recreation centers. Wherever you are in the vicinity of others, you can get to know people, and, in that conversation, you can add an invitation to join you on Sunday morning. Even if all you do is to share the online worship link, that is a beginning. So, let us step outside of the building and share this wonderful church with others.

<u>Fun fact</u>: Halloween, a holiday observed on October 31 and noted for its pagan and religious roots and secular traditions. In much of Europe and most of North America, observance of Halloween is largely nonreligious, celebrated with parties, spooky costumes, jack-o'-lanterns, pumpkin carvings, and the giving of candy. But the holiday also marks the beginning of Allhallotide, a three-day Christian triduum dedicated to remembering the dead that begins with Halloween (October 31) and is followed by All Saints' Day (November 1) and All Souls' Day (November 2).
